to be held Friday afternoon, October 8th, at The Peabody Hotel in downtown Little Rock.

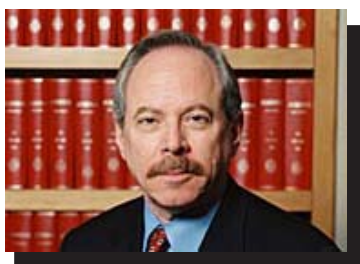
